

Memorial: 6 October

Profile

Educated in Paris and Rheims, France. Ordained c.1055. Taught theology; one of his students later became Pope Blessed Urban II. Presided over the cathedral school at Rheims from 1057 to 1075. Criticized the worldliness he saw in his fellow clergy. He opposed Manasses, Archbishop of Rheims, because of his laxity and mismanagement. Chancellor of the archdiocese of Rheims. Following a vision he received of a secluded hermitage where he could spend his life becoming closer to God, he retired to a mountain near Chartreuse in Dauphiny in 1084 and with the help of Saint Hugh of Grenoble, he founded what became the first house of the Carthusian Order; he and his brothers supported themselves as manuscript copyists. Assistant to Pope Urban II in 1090, and supported his efforts at reform. Retiring from public life, he and his companions built a hermitage at Torre, where, 1095, the monastery of Saint Stephen was built. Bruno combined in the religious life the eremetical and the cenobitic; his learning is apparent from his scriptural commentaries.



Born: 1030 at Cologne, Germany

Died: 1101 at Torre, Calabria, Italy of natural causes buried in the church of Saint Stephen at Torre

Canonized: 1623

Patronage: possessed people, Ruthenia



THE HOLY SPIRIT-DIVINUM ILLUD

An Encyclical Letter by Pope Leo XIII - May 9, 1897

3. “Appropriation”

In our last article, I discussed the indivisibility of the Blessed Trinity. If the Trinity is indivisible why do we attribute certain actions to one Divine Person rather than to the Others? It is we humans, not God, who make such decisions because our finite minds cannot comprehend Divine Action of the Three Persons as inseparable. We believe as Catholics that all operations of the Trinity are inseparable but have great difficulty understanding this Mystery.

To better understand this Mystery, our finite minds attribute particular characteristics “to the Person whose particular characteristics they most reflect: To the Father, works of omnipotence; to the Son, works of wisdom, harmony and beauty; to the Holy Spirit, works of goodness and love.”(1) Remember, it is we humans who craft this decision, not God. Thus, it is the Father, the Principal of the whole Godhead, to whom we consign the Primary cause of all things. I previously noted that St. Paul uses the words “of Him, by Him and in Him are all things”; accordingly “of Him” refers to the Father. The Son, the Word, the image of God, is the exemplary cause from whom all humans borrow their form and beauty. “By Him” therefore refers to the Son. The Holy Spirit is the ultimate cause of all things. He is the Divine Goodness, that is, the Mutual Love of the Father and Son completes and perfects the work man’s eternal salvation: “In Him (the Holy Spirit) are all things”.(2)

4. The Holy Spirit and Jesus Christ

We see in the man Jesus, the physical Christ, the power of the Holy Spirit in his Incarnation. Though this work belongs to the whole Trinity, we appropriate this act to the Holy Spirit as is noted in Matt. 1: 18, 20: “She was found with child of the Holy Spirit,” and “that which is conceived in her is of the Holy Spirit”.(3) Consider this thought: “In the whole life and death of Jesus...all His actions were performed “through the Holy Spirit”. St. Augustine writes: “This manner in which Christ was born of the Holy Spirit, indicates to us the grace of God, by which a human nature, with no antecedent merits, at the first moment of its existence, was united with the Word of God, by so intimate a personal union, that He, who was the Son of Man, was also the Son of God, and He, who was the Son of God, was also the Son of Man”.(4) Question: Can we, in this world of ours, now or ever, fully understand this concept through our intelligence or study? Don’t sweat it. We can’t.

We know that Jesus was symbolically baptized by St. John the Baptist. However the Holy Spirit was present “visibly over Christ, though in the form of a Dove, foreshadowing His outward and visible mission in the Church.”(5) Friends, I leave you here so I can tackle the issue of the Mystical Christ which is the living union of Jesus and His Church over the next two weeks. Peace.

The Constitution of the United States

Article IV

Section 1.

Full faith and credit shall be given in each state to the public acts, records, and judicial proceedings of every other state. And the Congress may by general laws prescribe the manner in which such acts, records, and proceedings shall be proved, and the effect thereof.

Section 2.

The citizens of each state shall be entitled to all privileges and immunities of citizens in the several states.

A person charged in any state with treason, felony, or other crime, who shall flee from justice, and be found in another state, shall on demand of the executive authority of the state from which he fled, be delivered up, to be removed to the state having jurisdiction of the crime.

~~No person held to service or labor in one state, under the laws thereof, escaping into another, shall, in consequence of any law or regulation therein, be discharged from such service or labor, but shall be delivered up on claim of the party to whom such service or labor may be due. (Note: Superseded by the Thirteenth Amendment.)~~

Section 3.

New states may be admitted by the Congress into this union; but no new states shall be formed or erected within the jurisdiction of any other state; nor any state be formed by the junction of two or more states, or parts of states, without the consent of the legislatures of the states concerned as well as of the Congress.

The Congress shall have power to dispose of and make all needful rules and regulations respecting the territory or other property belonging to the United States; and nothing in this Constitution shall be so construed as to prejudice any claims of the United States, or of any particular state.

Section 4.

The United States shall guarantee to every state in this union a republican form of government, and shall protect each of them against invasion; and on application of the legislature, or of the executive (when the legislature cannot be convened) against domestic violence.
